The painstaking level of detail that goes into making the lighting also goes into selecting just the right style for custom pieces. "When we do custom work it can be inspired by a number of things, but first and foremost is the home. Each home that we work on is unique, and should be

addressed that way. That is why we all but insist that our clients send us elevations or photos so that we can tell them the appropriate style and size of light fixtures for their home." He strives to ensure each and every light truly suits the space in which it is placed. "We don't someone to just order something because they saw a pretty picture in a catalog or on a website."
